







Stewardship:...

is the willingness to be accountable for the well being of the larger organisation by operating in service, rather than control of those around us.

Peter Block Stewardship holds the possibility of shifting our expectation of people in power.




is to hold in trust the well-being of some larger entity – our organisation, our community, the earth itself.

Service is central to the idea of stewardship.




Stewardship is a willingness to work on ourselves first, to stay in intimate contact with those around us, to own our doubts and limitations, and make them part of our dialogue with others.







Anecdotal evidence indicates that people are cynical about stewardship.


The empirical evidence however, shows that they appreciate serious instruction and will participate if asked.
